 in Law Roger Cusley one shilling in money And the reason why  
 I give him not more is because he was very bound to his late wife  
 whilst living and to me since her death for which I pray God forgive  
 him Item I give to my sister Alice Berkow widdow the summe of  
 fourscore pound of lawfull monny of England to be paid her within  
 one month next after my decease Likewise I give unto her my silver  
 shewe my black silke mantle gowne my black silke petticoate and a  
 feather bed and all that belonge to it linnen and woollen Item I  
 give to her daughter Martha my silke gowne Item I give to my  
 Kinswoman Margaret Dycker twenty pounde in money to be paid  
 to her within one month next after my decease Item I give to Sarah  
 Dycker widdow five pounde but my will is that it be paid to my  
 Overseers and they to issue it out to her by such parts and proportio  
 as they shall thinke fitt Item I give to Mr. Willm. Whitcheard and  
 Mr. John Blaunt Overseers I doe appoint Overseers of this my  
 Will twenty shillings a pece as small tokens of my respecte to them  
 and I doe intreat them to be assistant in the execution of this my  
 Will Item in confidence that my Kinsman Robert Berkow  
 will improve it I give and bequeath all the rest and residue of  
 my monny plate goods householdstuff and personall estate  
 whatsoever and wheresoever (my debts legacies and funerall  
 expens first paid and satisfied) unto him the said Robert Berkow  
 and his wife and thre sones equally between them And I doe make  
 and constitute him the said Robert Berkow sole and whole Executor  
 of this my last Will and Testament Lastly I doe hereby revoke  
 annul and make void all former and other Wills and Deeds of Gift  
 by me at any time heretofore made in writing or otherwise And  
 I doe publish and declare this to be my last Will and Testament  
 In Witness whereof I have hereunto putt my hand and scale this  
 Thirteenth day of December in the year of our Lord God (according  
 to the computation now used in England) one thousand six hundred  
 ninety and one. The marke of the said Susanna Corb Then signed

 for evermore And as touching my body I commit the same (after this  
 life) to be decently and in Christian like manner buried according to  
 the direction of my loving freinds M<sup>r</sup>. John Wilgim Cap<sup>t</sup>.  
 Dobbin and M<sup>r</sup>. Walter Coppinger of whom I also desire that  
 they would see my debts in Barbadoe and severall charges  
 satisfied and paid And also to the best of their tate provide a mate  
 taxable to carry and navigate the said Ship under my commaund  
 to the Port of the Citty of London or other Port or place of  
 discharge in the Kingdom of England And as touching the  
 worldly estate both real and personall which God of his mercy  
 shall be pleased to bless me withall at the time of my decease  
 I give and bequeath the same unto my wellbeloved wife Frances  
 Corbin and to her heirs and Assignes for ever to doe and  
 dispose thereof according to her and their willo and pleasures And  
 I doe nominate and appoint my said wife to be the sole Excutrix  
 of this my last Will and Testament, and none other nor otherwise  
 In Testimony whereof I have herunto set my hand and seale the  
 three and twentieth day of June Anno Dni One Thousand  
 Six hundred Fifty One. Signed sealed published  
 and declared by the said Testator as and for his very last Will  
 and Testament in the presence of us The marke of Daniell  
 Brandige John Martin Joseph Wybe Tho. Gateward.
